"And him that cometh to me I will in no wise cast out." John 6:37

Are you still unconverted? Oh, that you may above all take the deliverance of your soul to heart! Oh, I pray you, do realize with all your zeal in your labor for a livelihood for your body, that you will have that same body in the day of resurrection.
